

2018 International Fire Code, New Jersey Edition





- Adopted April 15, 2024
- Operative April 15, 2025
  - One year was provided between the adoption and date the provisions will actually be enforced.
  - This time is being used to educate business and property owners on how and where the provisions will be applied.

### N.J.A.C. 5:70-3, 305.6 LANDSCAPE MATERIALS

The use of combustible landscape materials, such as wood-based mulch products, is prohibited in any of the following conditions:

- 1. Within 18 inches of any building or structure;
- 2. Within 18 inches of a deck, porch, balcony, or any other portion of the building constructed of combustible material; or
- 3. Within 18 inches of any designated smoking area defined in Section 310.2.



### N.J.A.C. 5:70-3, 305.6 LANDSCAPE MATERIALS

### **Exceptions:**

1. Live plant material such as shrubs, flowers and trees provided that they are not beneath a combustible overhang with less than 6 feet of clearance.

2. Non-combustible building or structure exteriors that have no combustible components or trim with less than 3 feet clearance from grade.

3. Fire-resistant mulch.






## NONCOMBUSTIBLE BUILDING AND TRIM



N.J.A.C. 5:70-3, 305.7 EXISTING MATERIALS This provision shall become operative on April 15, 2025, all occupancies subject to this code shall remove all combustible landscape materials that are located within 18 inches of the foundation of any building or structure or in the area of any designated smoking area. This product may be replaced with noncombustible materials such as stone or sand.



- Keep wood mulch 18" away from combustible exteriors of buildings such as wood or vinyl siding. Don't put mulch against a building.
- Maintain a clear dirt area or use materials such as pea stone or crushed rock for the first 18" as a barrier around the foundation of a building.
- Provide proper receptacles for smoking materials at entrances to buildings (place at least 36" away from the building) and in designated smoking areas. Emptied at least weekly and do not mulch these areas.
- Train maintenance staff to watch for mulch fires, especially when mulch is fresh or weather is very hot and dry or windy.

THIS PHOTO IS FROM THE FRONT OF THE BUILDING, YOU CAN SEE THE SPACE BETWEEN THE BUILDING EXTERIOR AND THE MULCH BED IS WHERE THE MASONRY EXTERIOR ENDS. UNDERNEATH AND BEHIND THE MASONRY EXTERIOR ARE COMBUSTIBLE COMPONENTS. DANGER WAS MINIMIZED BY USING PEA GRAVEL INSTEAD OF MULCH.
